Big Bash brings in crowds at Bellerive

The KFC Twenty20 Big Bash matches recently held at Bellerive Oval saw nearly thirteen thousand people cheer on the PKF Tasmanian Tigers as they took on the Blues on December 30 and the Warriors on New Year's Day, with the PKF Tigers picking up an exciting win in their second match.

The popularity of the Twenty20 format continues to rise and a 37% jump in KFC Big Bash interstate Twenty20 TV ratings this week shows that ambitious plans for the format's expansion as an Aussie-style IPL are well founded, according to Cricket Australia Chief Executive Officer James Sutherland.

"The KFC Big Bash season launch this week resulted in big crowds in Brisbane, Perth and Hobart and the Twenty20 cricket on FoxSport was the week's most

popular subscription TV viewing," he said.

"The inclusion of overseas stars such as Chris Gayle, Dwayne Bravo and Shahid Afridi is making this season's contest a Bigger Bash, so to speak, and performances by increasingly high profile state players such as Dave Warner, Stephen Smith and Tim Paine this week are also helping the turnstiles click faster".



Kim Fazackerley honoured with new medal in her name

Cricket Tasmania announced last month that the TCA Women's Grade Cricketer of the year medal will be named after Tasmanian-born all-rounder Kim Fazackerley who is the only female cricketer from Tasmania to represent Australia in Test and One-Day cricket.

Kim played three Tests and nine One-Day Internationals for Australia between 1991 and 1996 and has represented and captained Tasmania as well as playing for Queensland and the ACT.

Cricket Tasmania Chairman Tony Harrison says the medal is an important milestone for women's cricket and it will

now form part of Tasmania's cricket heritage.

"Women's cricket in Tasmania is continuing to increase in popularity, with female participation more than doubling this season, and Kim's achievements certainly serve as an example to today's young players of what can be achieved. Cricket Tasmania is delighted to name the medal after Kim in recognition of her trail-blazing efforts in the sport," Mr Harrison said.

Kim Fazackerley will present the medal to the Women's Grade Cricketer of the Year for 2009-10 at the Emerson Rodwell Medal.

Reserving of seats on match days

Seating is on a first-come-first-served basis, unless otherwise advised by Cricket Tasmania management.

The reserving of seats in the Members' Pavilion for friends or relatives is not permitted. Courtesy, privacy and security demands that personal belongings should not be handled by others. If you have any concerns or questions in relation to other people's belongings, please speak to the Cricket Tasmania door usher. It is not acceptable to reserve a seat by placing belongings on it and then leaving the Members' Pavilion with a view to returning some time later or to reserve seats for others arriving at a later time.

In the likely event of capacity attendance during international matches, Members' seating facilities will be increased through use of the Gallery Bar in conjunction with the main Members' Pavilion. On match-days when capacity attendance is likely, the walkway between the Members' Pavilion and the Gallery Bar will be open to facilitate ease of passage between the areas.

The spirit of fair play to all fellow Members is essential if the amenities are to be for the benefit and enjoyment of all Members.

Mis-use of Members' cards

Members are reminded of their obligations regarding holding Cricket Tasmania membership which is a valuable and highly sought after commodity and we urge you to respect the Association's rules in its usage.

Members are reminded of the strictly non-transferable provisions of their membership card. This is without exception and also precludes lending of the card within the family. Lending of a card will result in the offending member or card user being asked to leave and possible suspension of the membership. Also, the Associate Card can only be used by one person at a time and if this privilege is abused penalties may apply.

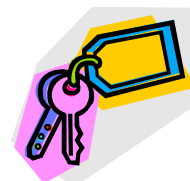
Overflow seats available
